

TEXAS LUTHERAN UP CLOSE



ocated on a spacious and inviting campus, Texas Lutheran University is a private, exclusively undergraduate university of the liberal arts, sciences and professional studies, located approximately 35 miles east of San Antonio and 50 miles south of Austin in the scenic community of Seguin.

Approximately 1,400 students attend the university, which has been recognized repeatedly by US News & World Report magazine as one of America's best colleges in the western United States. The school has also been recognized for diversity and for value. TLU also has been included in The Princeton Review list of best colleges in the western United States in recent years.

With roots dating back to 1891, the university located in Seguin in 1912, where it operated as an academy until 1928 when it achieved junior college status. In 1948, Texas Lutheran became a senior liberal arts college. It is one of the 28 colleges and universities related to the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and the only one in the southwestern United States.

Academic Life

Texas Lutheran grants the bachelor of arts, bachelor of science, bachelor of music, and bachelor of business administration degrees. The school boasts 39 academic majors and preprofessional programs.

Texas Lutheran graduates include a federal judge, state legislators, prominent attorneys, physicians, medical school faculty members, accountants, bank presidents, pastors, bishops, teachers, social workers, and faculty members at universities such as Johns Hopkins, Southern Methodist and Duke.

The academic program at Texas Lutheran is designed to provide an education that makes both life and professional work exciting and fulfilling. Students at Texas Lutheran pursue a broad education in the arts, sciences, humanities and professional studies, while following targeted programs of study that prepare them for employment or for advanced study at graduate or specialized professional schools.

Special academic programs include the Mexican

American Studies Center, international education, the TLU Honors Program, and a wellness program known as the Krost Life Enrichment Program.

Many students also choose to participate in a variety of off-campus programs that offer academic credit. These include the Washington Semester Program in Washington, D.C. (including the World Capitals Program); and the TLU Exchange Program with Kansai Ghadhi University near Osaka, Japan. Texas Lutheran is also affiliated with Augsburg College's study center in Cuernavaca, Mexico. Membership in the International Student Exchange Program enables students from TLU to study at dozens of foreign universities. Reciprocal programs bring international students to Texas Lutheran as well.

Texas Lutheran offers students a variety of internships, through which undergraduates have an opportunity for hands-on, experiential learning at organizations including government agencies, businesses, media outlets, law offices, and research facilities.

Students also participate in a wide range of campus organizations, including the campus ministry program, academic honor societies, local social sororities and fraternities, the band, the choir, the TLU strings program, theatre, student publications, the Student Government Association, the Black Student Union, the Mexican American Student Association, and the Center for Women's Studies.

Intercollegiate Athletics

TLU is competitive in 14 NCAA men's and women's intercollegiate sports, including volleyball, soccer, softball, basketball, golf, tennis, track and field and cross country for women and football, basketball, basketball, soccer, tennis and golf for men.

Intercollegiate sports are supplemented by a variety of intramural sports.

Worship services are held at 10 a.m. on Monday, Wednesday and Friday and at 6:30 p.m. Sundays during the academic year in the Chapel of the Abiding Presence, Weinert Memorial. Other special services are held throughout the year. Contact the Campus Ministry Office at 830-372-8160 for more details.

The university offers an extensive series of cultural arts programs each year, including performances by the TLU choir, band, and dramatic media programs. The university's 1,050-seat Jackson Auditorium plays host to community and TLU events throughout the year, including Mid-Texas Symphony concerts, visiting lecturers, traveling theatre and music productions, the annual Texas Lutheran Christmas Vespers, as well as a community-wide celebration in honor of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. For more information on TLU's cultural events, call the University Relations Office at 830-372-8020.

The Annetta Kraushaar Gallery, located in the Schuech Fine Arts Center, hosts a variety of exhibits throughout the year. Call 830-372-6015 for exhibit information

Community Resources

The Fiedler Memorial Museum, located on the first floor of Langner Hall, has geological displays of general interest and serves as a resource for earth science and geography classes and off-campus groups. To make an appointment to visit the museum, call 830-372-6094.

The Fiedler Memorial Rock Garden is located just outside Langner Hall. It displays various types of rocks from across the state. The rock garden is open at all times and has written trail guides in a box outside the gate.

The Mexican American Studies Center is located in Langner Hall. Mexican, Mexican American, and Central American books, magazines, and videos are available for review and consultation in the center.

The Texas Lutheran University Bookstore, located inside the Alumni Student Center, is also open to the public, offering TLU apparel, specialty items, school supplies, general books and textbooks. Call 830-372-8140 for more information.

Through its Center for Professional Development, the university focuses on advancing the educational interests of students and professionals in the workplace. Hein Dining Hall, a 21,600 square foot building, provides for the food service needs of the university, as well as for community events held on campus that require food service. Community groups wishing to hold functions in the dining hall should contact Sodexho Food Service at 830-372-8085.

TLU's Mabee Aquatic Center is an eight-lane, collegiate-size swimming pool that offers the community memberships, water aerobics, and swim

lessons for children of all ages, including "water babies" classes. For information about the Mabee Aquatic Center, call 830-372-8120. In addition, the public is welcome to use the one-kilometer jogging/walking trail on campus in the area of the tennis courts and softball fields.

Blumberg Memorial Library houses more than 250,000 library items and subscribes to 650 current periodical titles. The library offers access to more than 6 million volumes through cooperative arrangement with 32 libraries in the Council of

Research and Academic Libraries (CORAL) in the greater San Antonio area. As a member of Online Computer Library Center (OCLC), the library accesses the world's largest database of more than 44 million bibliographical records and can obtain materials for students and faculty through its 37,000-member libraries worldwide via the OCLC Interlibrary Loan System.



AT HOME IN SEGUIN, TEXAS

A vibrant community with a population of almost 25,000 nestled on the banks of the picturesque Guadalupe River, Seguin is strategically located in South Central Texas on Interstate Highway 10, and the main east-west Union Pacific rail lines. San Antonio, the 10th largest city in the United States, is 30 minutes west of Seguin via IH-10, while Austin, the state capital, is conveniently accessible 50 miles to the north by State Highway 123 and Interstate 35. The ports of Houston and Corpus Christi are nearly equal distance (160 miles) from Seguin

The beautiful Guadalupe River cuts through the city's south side. A fine public park was built alongside it, beginning during the Depression years when Seguin enjoyed its oil boom. A scenic drive lined with picnic tables shadows the river for a mile or so, flanked by an 18-hole golf course. Nearby are the fairgrounds, volleyball courts, ballparks, and a country club.

Nowadays both Interstate 10 and a main line of the Union Pacific pass through the town's north side, where most manufacturing is located. Today the heart of the city is filled with fine old homes in traditional neighborhoods. And the city is ringed by contemporary residential developments as well. In addition, just outside the current city limits, hundreds of handsome riverfront homes sit along the shores of Lake McQueeney, Lake Placid, and Meadow Lake on the beautiful Guadalupe

Telephone/Web/E-mail Services

Matador Stadium is equipped with a phone line and multiple Ethernet connections. The phone line is used for visiting radio broadcasts, and it is available for reporter use once the visiting radio broadcast has concluded. Ethernet connections support sending of stories and of photos.

Fax services, if necessary, are available at the TLU Office of Sports Information, a five-minute car ride from Matador Stadium. Sports Information assistants can accompany reporters to the SID office.

Practice Schedule

During the season, Texas Lutheran football practice begins at 3 p.m. with pre-practice taping and treatment. Early-outs usually begin at 3:30 p.m. with formal practice beginning at 4 p.m. and running to 6 - 6:30 p.m.

During the week, the best times for individual interviews with coaches are in the morning hours. For players, the best interview times are 3 - 3:45 p.m. With all coach and player interviews, appointments should be made with the TLU Office of Sports Information. If traveling on Interstate 35, exit on Highway 46 in New Braunfels (Exit 189). Go south (right) on Highway 46 for approximately 15 miles. TLU will be on your left. San Antonio - 35 miles Laredo - 182

From Austin and points north – We recommend that you approach Texas Lutheran from Interstate 35 until you reach San Marcos. Exit on Highway 123 and turn south (left). At the Interstate 10 intersection as you enter Seguin, go west (right) on Interstate 10. Exit Interstate 10 at the Highway 46 exit (Exit 607). Go south (left) on Highway 46 for 1/2 mile. TLU will be on your left. Austin - 50 miles • Dallas - 253 miles

From Houston and points east – You will approach TLU from Interstate 10. The Texas Lutheran campus is on the west side of town. Proceed west on the interstate and take the Highway 46 exit (Exit 607). Go south (left) on Highway 46 for 1/2 mile. TLU will be on your left. Houston - 160 miles

From Corpus Christi and points south - You will approach Texas Lutheran from Highway 123. As you near Seguin, take Highway 46 north and continue to the Highway 46 and Court Street (Highway 90A) intersection. Turn east (right) on Court Street, and TLU will be on your left. Corpus Christi – 141 miles • Brownsville – 275 miles

From San Antonio and points west – You can approach from Interstate 10 or Interstate 35. If traveling on Interstate 10, exit on Highway 123 (Stockdale exit). Go south (right) on Highway 123 for 1 mile. Stadium will be on your right.

From Corpus Christi and points south - You will approach Texas Lutheran from Highway 123. Take Highway 123 into town. Turn left on Cedar St. Stadium will be on your left. Corpus Christi - 141 miles • Brownsville - 275 miles

Ann M. Svennungsen President

President Ann M. Svennungsen was born and raised in Shelby, Montana. After graduating summa cum laude in mathematics from Concordia College in Moorhead, Minnesota, she received her Master of Divinity degree from Luther Seminary, St. Paul, Minnesota.

Spending 22 years in pastoral ministry, Svennungsen served congregations in Iowa City, Iowa and Minneapolis, Minnesota. In 1996 she became senior pastor of Trinity Lutheran Church in Moorhead, Minnesota, a 3,700-member congregation and,

at that time, the largest ELCA congregation to be led by a woman senior pastor. In 2003, Svennungsen was named president of Atlanta-based Fund for Theological Education, a national, ecumenical organization devoted to raising the next generation of excellent and diverse ministers and scholars, annually providing \$1.2 million in

scholarships and other support. In July, 2007, she came to Seguin where she now brings her background of leadership and scholarship to the community of Texas Lutheran University.

Speaking to the role of athletics at TLU, Svennungsen notes:

"I am delighted to lead a school where one third of our students participate in intercollegiate athletics and another third participate in intramurals. The experience of playing in a sport is as important as ever. In a world shaped by individualistic activities like Xbox, Tivo and net surfing, young people can spend their lives in what some call a cocoon of autonomy. We need the communal, engaging activities that athletics provide. To grow into our full selves, we need activities that require our whole being in relationship with others. So many strengths are learned on a team: dedication, team work, leadership, seeing the entire field, anticipating the opponent's move, knowing your teammates, building them up, holding them accountable – so terrific for life and work.

Perhaps, there's someone at TLU today who will one day be a famous sports celebrity like Verne Lundquist (Hall of Fame CBS sports commentator and TLU alumnus). But, without question, our TLU student athletes will be known in their communities for their job skills, their life skills - and for being the kind of upright, quality citizens our world so desperately needs.

Svennungsen is married to Dr. William Russell, a Reformation specialist and scholar in residence in the TLU theology department. They have three children: Sarah, an attorney in Minneapolis; Mary a senior volleyball player at the University of Pennsylvania and John, a rancher at the Down Home Ranch near Elgin, Texas.

Svennungsen has the distinction of being the first female president in the 118-year history of Texas Lutheran University.



Bill Miller Director of Athletics

As director of athletics. Bill Miller has led the Bulldogs to unprecedented success in NCAA Division III athletics. After spearheading the conversion of the sports program from NCAA Division II to NCAA Division III, Miller has guided TLU Athletics to two national championships in women's track and field (relay titles in 2007 and in 2008), 13 American Southwest Conference titles (three in cross country, two in women's volleyball, three in baseball, two in men's golf, one in women's golf, one in women's track and field, and one in men's

soccer) and to 15 ASC West Division crowns (seven in women's volleyball, seven in baseball, one in softball, and two in men's soccer).

In Miller's tenure, the Bulldogs have hosted an NCAA Division III Men's Soccer National Tournament playoff game, an ASC Championship Men's Soccer Tournament, an ASC Cross Country Championship Meet and two ASC Championship Volleyball Tournaments. In 2008, TLU will host the 2008 NCAA Division III South/Southeast Regional Cross Country

The Bulldogs have sent teams to NCAA Division III Championship meets and tournaments in women's golf, men's golf, women's volleyball, baseball, women's cross country, and women's track and field (indoor and outdoor).

TLU's success under Miller has extended to the classroom, where the Bulldogs have produced 16 ESPN The Magazine Academic All-Americans since 2001. (TLU has produced a grand total of 17 ESPN The Magazine Academic All-Americans in its history.) Amber Lowe was named an ESPN The Magazine Academic All-American in Women's Cross Country/Women's Track and Field for the 2008-09 academic year. For Lowe, the honor was her second Academic All-America honor in two seasons.

Miller coached the TLU baseball team for 15 seasons and has the most wins in TLU baseball history. He has the highest winning percentage of any coach in TLU Athletics history. Miller and the Bulldogs made three appearances in the NCAA Division III Baseball Championships and six appearances in the NAIA district and regional playoffs.

TLU played in the NCAA DIII West Regional Championships in 2005, 2006 and 2007. TLU was the regional runner-up in 2005 and 2006. The Bulldogs finished second at the 2000 NAIA Region VI Tournament. Counting post-season conference tournaments, the Bulldogs played beyond the regular season in 11 of Miller's 15 seasons.

Miller was a summa cum laude graduate of Texas Lutheran in 1977. He played baseball and football for the Bulldogs and was a member of the 1974 and 1975 NAIA-II football national championships, led by TLU Hall of Famer Jim Wacker. On the diamond for the Bulldogs, Miller was 20-13 as a pitcher and was the Big State Conference Most Valuable

Miller and his wife Dayna have three children: Cody, Kate and Cason. Cody and Kate now both attend TLU

Amy is the daughter of Janet and Donald Menzies. She has a sister, Julie.




Tim Clark Director of Sports Information



Texas Lutheran continues to expand and improve its athletic facilities and venues to meet the needs of its student body. The university and its leaders believe that athletics – both intercollegiate and intramural – play an important role in the educational experience at Texas Lutheran. The university is committed to providing the funding, the facilities and the personnel to ensure that the lessons learned through athletics are available to each student at TLU.

The Marvin Rinn Field House:

Among the newest facilities on campus is the 14,000 square foot Marvin Rinn Field House, completed in August 1998. It houses the Bulldog football locker room, a video and meeting center, laundry facilities, coaches' office and a state-of-the-art sports medicine facility. The sports medicine area comes complete with the room and the resources to support the entire Texas Lutheran athletics program. The Rinn Field House also is home to the Bulldog baseball and men's soccer locker rooms. There is also a separate coaches' locker room and shower area. The mens' sports in the field house share the large shower area located in the center of the facility

The Tostengard Activity Center:

Named for Ardyce and Stanford Tostengard, former chair of the Texas Lutheran Board of Regents, Tostengard is the home for all Texas Lutheran home volleyball matches. It is also a primary intramural facility for the university.

Gustafson Soccer Field:

Home to the men and women's soccer teams of Texas Lutheran, Gustafson Soccer Field is named for A.G. Gustafson, a former coach, professor and interim president at Texas Lutheran. A new soccer field was constructed on campus in 1998 and rededicated as Gustafson Soccer Field. The field is located on Fleming Drive, across from the President's residence.

The Krost Fitness Trail:

The trail, built in the early 90s, circles the campus intramural fields, the softball complex and the tennis courts. It is open to the public. The Seguin community and the TLU campus community enjoy jogging and walking with their friends and families. The trail is approximately one kilometer.

Katt-Isbel Field:

Home of the Bulldog baseball team, Katt-Isbel Field seats 450 people in its stadium seating. The field was originally dedicated in 1992 in honor of Mark Isbel, a 1981 graduate and baseball player from San Antonio who died of cancer on June 7, 1983. The field was re-dedicated on Feb. 27, 1999, in honor of former Texas Lutheran head baseball coach Ray Katt.

Kieffer Kinesiology Lab:

The 2,200 square-foot Kieffer Kinesiology Lab, located adjacent to the Jones Physical Education Complex, uses state-of-the-art equipment to collect and analyze two- and three-dimensional human motion. The research and learning laboratory is one of a few stand-alone facilities built exclusively for motion analysis in the United States, and it provides TLU's undergraduate students with a unique opportunity to explore research problems and apply scientific theory.

Morck Softball Field:

It was officially dedicated in 1992 in honor of Theos Morck, a former vice president of fiscal affairs at TLU. He and his wife Nile Ruth were longtime supporters of Texas Lutheran athletic teams. The field is home to all university softball games. It has a seating capacity of 350.

TLU Tennis Courts:

The tennis complex was expanded in the mid-1990s to its current nine-court setup. The complex has seating capacity of 50 for feature matches. It is located on University Drive, across from the Alumni Student Center and next to the Dr. Burton F. Grossman Fitness Center.

Matador Stadium:

Built in the mid-1950's on the Seguin High School campus, Matador Stadium is the home football venue for the Bulldogs. It has a seating capacity of 9,000. It is located on the corner of US Highway 123 and Cedar Street in Seguin. The stadium is complete with a double-deck press box.

Memorial Gymnasium:

The home for the Bulldogs men and women's basketball teams has a seating capacity of 1,500. Commonly referred to as "The Doghouse," Memorial Gymnasium was constructed in 1954. It is connected to the Jones Physical Education Complex and is located on University Drive, across from the Alumni Student Center.

Dr. Burton E. Grossman Fitness Center:

The fitness center, opened in 1998, contains state-of-the-art equipment for weight training and cardiovascular exercise for use by the entire campus community. The facility also includes locker rooms and classroom space, plus easy locker room access to the university's eight-lane swimming pool, the Mabee Pool.

George Kieffer Football Practice Field:

The practice field is located behind the Marvin Rinn Field House, and it is the home for all football practices and workouts.

TLU Golf Pitch-and-Putt Course:

For use by the TLU golf teams, the pitch-and-putt course has an elevated green and pot bunker, plus a driving range. The golf teams have access to local courses Starcke Municipal Golf Course (in Seguin), The Golf Club of Seguin, and The Bandit at Long Creek (in nearby McQueeney) for daily on-course practice.

ennis Parker is in his third year as head coach for the Texas Lutheran Bulldogs. Parker returned to his Texas coaching roots in 2007 after coaching in Mesa, Ariz., at Mesa High School,

Parker led TLU to a two-win improvement in 2008. TLU went 4-6 last season after opening with a 2-8 campaign in 2007, Parker's first year with the program.

Parker was hired on Jan. 22, 2007 as the 22nd coach in school history

At the time of his hiring, Parker said, "I am humbled to be at a school that has produced Tommy Mueller and Jim Wacker as coaches and to be at a school that has produced players like Mike Washington, Phil Dunne and D.W. Rutledge. I am honored and grateful and excited to work at making this an exciting and meaningful time in the young lives of the TLU players."

Parker and the TLU Bulldogs won just two games in 2007, but the team showed progress throughout the year as it coped with the opening-game loss of senior quarterback Joel Waldon (who returned to play in 2008). Even without an experienced quarterback, the offense (with Parker calling the plays as offensive coordinator) averaged 26.1 points per game and 306.8 yards of total offense per game.

In Parker's offense, then sophomore (now senior) running back Anthony Smith flourished and set TLU NCAA Division III-era records for rushing yards in a season (1,066) and all-purpose yards (1,989). Smith ended 2007 as the fifth-ranked all-purpose back in the

In 2008, Parker and the Bulldogs showed improvement on defense and posted three wins on the road (with victories at Sul Ross State, McMurry and Howard Payne). The Bulldogs shut out McMurry on Oct. 25 in Abilene and finished 2008 with the thirdbest scoring defense in TLU's 11 seasons as an NCAA Division III program. The Bulldogs allowed nearly a touchdown per game less in 2008 than in 2007.

Parker also coached senior tight end Tv Palmer in 2008, the year in which Palmer shared the inaugural ASC Sportsmanship Athlete of the Year Award for football with ZaVious Robbins of Hardin-Simmons and Brannon Willisson of Mississippi College.

In addition to Palmer's honor in '08, five Bulldogs – senior offensive lineman John Paul Bloomer, thenjunior defensive end James Villarreal, senior defensive back Dwight Bonner, then-junior wide receiver Steven Thrash and sophomore linebacker Jarrad McAdams were named to the All-ASC Second Team. Junior, now senior, punter Frank Vera took a spot on the All-ASC Honorable Mention team. Thrash, Villarreal, and Vera are key returners for the Bulldogs in 2009.

In the three years prior to TLU, Parker coached Mesa High School in Mesa, Ariz., to a 3-7 record in 2004, a 5-5 mark in 2005 and a 7-4 record in 2006. Parker guided the Jackrabbits to the state playoffs in 2006. For Mesa, the playoff appearance was its first since 2000.

Parker has collegiate coaching experience as the head coach of NCAA Division I University of North Texas. He coached at North Texas for the 1991, 1992 and 1993 seasons. Parker was also an assistant coach at Southeast Missouri State University from 1977 to 1981.

Parker won a state championship at Marshall High School in Marshall, Texas in 1990. Parker took the job at Marshall after serving as the offensive coordinator for Converse Judson on its 1983 state championship team.

While at Converse Judson, Parker coached for Texas Lutheran Hall of Famer Frank Arnold as Arnold's offensive coordinator. Another TLU Hall of Famer, Rutledge, was the defensive coordinator at Converse Judson while Parker was the Judson offensive

Parker has had football head coaching stops in Texas at San Antonio Edison High School, Marshall High School and Cleburne High School. He has been a Texas high school assistant football coach at San Antonio Edison, San Antonio Holmes and Converse Judson. He was named the Texas High School Coach of the Year in 1988 and in 1990

Parker has served as athletic director at Marshall High School, Cleburne High School, Keller Independent School District in Keller, Texas, and Ector County Independent School District in Odessa, Texas.

Parker and his wife, Merry, lived in Seguin for three years while Parker coached at Converse Judson. The Parkers have two grown children, Kimberly and Sam.

2009 Season Preview

BULLDOGS: BATTLING FOR THE TOP



The 2009 Texas Lutheran Bulldogs and thirdvear Head Coach Dennis Parker return 17 starters (seven on offense, seven on defense, and three on special teams) from a 2008 squad that went 4-6 overall and 3-5 in the American Southwest

Last year the Bulldogs went 3-0 in league play against the bottom three teams in the conference -Sul Ross State, McMurry and Howard Payne – but went 0-5 against the better teams in the league – with losses to ASC Champion Mary Hardin-Baylor, runner-up Hardin-Simmons, Mississippi College, East Texas Baptist and Louisiana College.

In TLU's three conference wins over McMurry, Howard Payne and Sul Ross State, TLU outscored its opponents 70-35.

In the five league losses, the Bulldogs were outscored 222-41. In four of those five losses, TLU failed to score more than one touchdown. And in three of those losses, opponents went over the 50point mark.

In TLU's final three games of 2008, the Bulldogs fell to Hardin-Simmons, Louisiana College and Mississippi College by final scores of 52-6, 29-7, and 52-7, respectively.

Those three season-ending losses came immediately on the heels of a three-game, midseason conference win streak against Howard Payne, Sul Ross State and McMurry.

The McMurry game, in particular, turned into a banner day for the TLU defense. On that sunny afternoon in Abilene, Texas, the Bulldogs dismantled the McMurry offense and posted its first shutout since the first game of the 2006 season. The Bulldogs held McMurry to 26 yards of total offense and forced five turnovers in an 18-0

TLU set a new school record for fewest passing yards by an opponent, holding McMurry to 21 yards through the air. McMurry completed 4-of-16 passes and threw three interceptions. TLU also held McMurry without a third-down conversion (0-for-13) and limited McMurry to 46 total offensive plays. McMurry rushed 30 times for five

But as far as season-highlights would go, the highlights really ended there in Abilene. The Bulldogs were over-matched in home losses to Hardin-Simmons (on Homecoming) and Mississippi College and could never quite get on track in a road loss to Louisiana College.

And while the team of 2008 had a senior quarterback in Joel Waldon, a smart and bruising fullback in Kyle Gillis, a play-making linebacker in Jarrad McAdams, and two savvy, talented secondary members (in Dwight Bonner and Robert Bonner – no relation), the 2009 team will need to do well without any of those important

players from a year ago. Waldon, Gillis, and the Bonners each graduated, and McAdams chose to end his TLU football career after two seasons. The Bulldogs also must find replacements for the following departed players, who spent most of last year in the starting lineup: Justin Rose (defensive line), Kash Greathouse (wide receiver), Ernie Garcia (right tackle), Josh Jimenez (right guard), Sean Doherty (center), John Paul Bloomer (left guard), Ty Palmer (fullback), Luis Pena (left tackle), Zach Rowland (defensive back), and Josh Spaw (place-kicker).

LOOKING AHEAD - WORK TN NN -

While the Bulldogs have some serious gaps to fill on offense and defense, the cupboard is by no means bare. All-Conference type players return on the offensive line (center Josh McNeil), at wide receiver (Steven Thrash), at running back (Anthony Smith), on the defensive line (James Villarreal and John Jackson), in the secondary (Dantrell Anderson), at linebacker (Jack Moses), and at punter (Frank Vera).

But the Bulldogs' fortunes on offense likely will rest on the play of an unproven quarterback. When Parker was asked in the preseason to name three keys to the season, he responded: "Quarterback, quarterback, quarterback."

OFFENSE -**DUARTERBACK**

TLU enters 2009 with several new faces at quarterback. Not one quarterback on the Bulldogs' preseason roster has taken a varsity collegiate snap. At the top of depth chart is junior transfer Jarret Buchholtz, who comes to the Bulldogs from NAIA school Texas College. Buchholtz has seen the majority of time at quarterback in the preseason and appears likely to be the team's opening day starter. Buchholtz, who played his high school ball at nearby Luling High School in Luling, Texas, stands 5foot-11 and weighs 195 pounds.

"Jarret is a transfer that came here looking for an opportunity, and he seized the moment," said Lou Orth. TLU's offensive coordinator. "Jarret has stepped up. He is mature and calm in his demeanor. He has a good grasp of the offense. His job right now is to operate the offense. He doesn't have to go out and win the game by himself. He just has to go out there and manage the game. He is a smart kid excited about what we are doing.'

David Jones, a 6-foot-1 and 190-pound

redshirt freshman from Bruni, Texas (Bruni H.S.), is near the top of the depth chart entering the 2009 season. Jones took a medical redshirt in 2008 and did not see varsity action. Luke Davis (Baytown/Baytown Christian), sophomore, also will battle for the time at

"Right now, character-wise, we have three great kids at the position," said Parker. "It all comes down to what you do when the pressure is on. What will you do when you line up and have that pressure to perform. Some people step up. The 'adversity quotient' is more a determinant of success than I.Q. How do you handle adversity? What will you do and how will you respond when things go wrong? We want a guy with a high 'A.Q.' That's the guy that will lead our football team."

Parker said the job of preparing the Bulldogs signal-caller for 2009 falls to Orth.

"I told Lou it is his job to develop a quarterback," said Parker. "His success and our success are not based on good speeches and theory. It's on how quickly and successfully we can develop a quarterback."

"If we can get to the point when our quarterback steps up and plays football, we'll be in a great position."

RUNNING BACK

Whoever wins the Bulldog quarterback job will have several experienced, offensive

weapons at his disposal. At the top of the offensive talent list is senior running back Anthony Smith (Bay City/Bay City/Blinn JC). In 2007, Smith (5-9, 179) rushed for a TLU DIIIera record 1,066 yards and scored a team-best 66 points. He scored six rushing TDs, four receiving TDs and had a 92-yard kickoff return for a touchdown on the opening kickoff of the 2007 season. That year Smith led the ASC in all purpose yards (a school-record 1,989) and finished fifth in the NCAA Division III in allpurpose yards per game (198.9).

But in 2008, Smith's production took a hit. Injuries throughout the season took their toll on Smith. He missed two games (the Homecoming loss to Hardin-Simmons and the season's final road game versus Louisiana College), and he had just 14 total carries and five total receptions in his final two active games of the year. Yet, Smith still led TLU in rushing yards, with 444 yards on 125 carries, and he scored two touchdowns.

In 2009, Parker says a healthy Smith again will be called upon to do just about everything for the Bulldogs. He'll be the feature back, a primary pass receiver, and one of the team's top return men in the kicking game.

"He is the focal point," says Parker. "He is the best player on the team. We want it to be like always with Anthony. We'll ask him to do everything. He might even play a little goal-line corner for us."

2008 SEASON PREVIEW

Smith will have some talented teammates in the backfield to help in the rushing and receiving production. Quinnten Cleveland, a junior squad member from Galveston (Ball), is the projected back-up to Smith. Cleveland is a powerful down-hill runner with good strength to break through tackles and with good speed to produce some break-away runs.

"Quinnten is a really smart football player," said Orth. "He understands his assignments. He's a strong runner with quick, thick legs. He's a well-rounded football player excited to be playing again. He's a good kid."

Another junior running back, Ralph Valdez, is looking to regain the form he showed in 2007 when he scored four rushing touchdowns. Valdez is another tough runner that has a nose for the goal line.

FULLBACK

Two newcomers, Eddie Pitts and Byron Hicks, currently sit atop the depth chart at fullback. Pitts is a 5-10, 220-pound freshman from San Antonio (Madison), and Hicks is a 5-11, 220-pound freshman from Missouri City, Texas (Hightower).

Converted fullback and two-year letterman Billy Hardee (5-10, 205, Houston/Marine Military Academy) is in contention for major playing time at the position. Hardee doesn't mind contact, as his experience on special teams and at linebacker have proven over his first two seasons.

OFFENSIVE LINE

The offensive line received a huge lift in the offseason when senior captain Josh McNeil returned to the team for his final season.

McNeil (6-0, 275, Killeen/Killeen) is a three-year starter that saw time as a student assistant coach in 2008. He was a 2007 ASC Honorable Mention selection at center.

Parker says McNeil's return is one of the top reasons the Bulldogs will be improved as an entire team.

"Josh McNeil is the leader of the football team," said Parker. "I've been coaching 38 years, and I've never had as good a leader as Josh McNeil. He leads where it is imperative to have leadership. He is a leader in practice and in the weight room."

What make McNeil so special as a center on the offensive line is his strength and leverage, says Parker.

"He uses that leverage and strength so well because those were the tools he was given," said Parker. "But the thing that is underrated about Josh is his mental toughness. The players I have had that have been successful are not necessarily the best athletes. It's the players that refuse to lose, and Josh refuses to lose."

McNeil is the only one of the projected starting lineup to have seen regular starting duty in a Bulldog lineup. Mike Slayden (So.- 1L, 6-0, 245, Helotes, Texas/O'Connor), Jerry Hill (So.-1L, 5-8, 280, Copperas Cove, Texas/Texas), Josh Goodlow (So.-1L, 6-4, 315, Austin, Texas/McCallum), and Jordan Gesch (So.-SQ, 6-3, 300, Round Rock, Texas/Round Rock) have one combined varsity start between them.

Slayden will start at left tackle, with Hill and Goodlow manning left and right guard positions, respectively. Gesch is the projected starter at right tackle. The back-ups are projected as: left tackle Shawn Kaltenbach (So.-TR, 6-2, 275, Cypress, Texas/Cypress Falls/Kansas Wesleyan), left guard Jaymes Castillo (Jr.-2L, 6-4, 315, San Antonio, Texas/Lee), center Matt Cannata (Fr.-FY, 5-10, 250, Richmond, Texas/Travis), right guard Daniel Villa (Fr.-FY, 5-10, 277, San Antonio, Texas/Fox Tech), and right tackle Jacob Laubach (Fr.-FY, 6-0, 225, San Antonio, Texas/Smithson Valley).

TIGHT END

The starting tight end is Shawn Small (Sr.-1L, 6-0, 250, San Antonio/Judson/Southwest Minnesota), who saw significant time in 2008 at tight end and on special teams. Small is a strong run blocker and pass protector, and he has good hands. Look for Small to be a top target in red zone situations.

"Small can stretch the field for us," said Orth. "Having him here to help the young tackles is key. He stretches the field vertically for us. He's a physical blocker and one of the leaders on the team."

Small's back-up is Andrew Wueste (Jr.-2L, 6-4, 240, San Antonio/Churchill). Wueste has gone back and forth from tight end and offensive line in his first two seasons with the Bulldogs. He could go back to the offensive line if depth becomes an issue there.

WIDE RECEIVER

At receiver, the Bulldogs welcome ASC Second Team All-Conference selection Steven Thrash (Sr.-2L, 6-0, 190, Hubbard, Texas/Hubbard), who had a break-out year in 2008. Thrash led the team in total catches (45), receiving yards (614), and touchdowns (5), and he went over 80 yards in a game on four different times (vs. Sul Ross State twice, Mary Hardin-Baylor, and Mississippi College). Thrash had 52-yard TD catch against nationally-ranked Mary Hardin-Baylor and caught a 77-yard TD pass from Joel Waldon in a home loss to Mississippi College. Thrash also had two TD receptions in a road win at Howard Payne. He finished 2008 with at least one catch in every game.

"Thrash has already proven that he can be an All-ASC player, and he should do nothing but get better," said Parker.

The Bulldogs also get a welcome return from Jonathon Randle (Sr.-3L, 6-5, 200, Prairie View, Texas/Waller), who is back after a knee injury he suffered just prior to the '08 preseason. In his last full season of competition (2007), Randle played in all 10 games and produced 17 catches for 240 yards with two touchdowns.

Parker says Randle's value isn't just measured by his statistics.

"Randle is the heartbeat," said Parker. "He pumps everybody up. It really hurt us last year when we lost him before the season. Jon is going to give us the enthusiasm and the leadership that we really need. I think he would have had a good year last year, but I think he'll have a great year this year."

With the Bulldogs employing a three-wide set on occasion, look for Vernon Hughes, a junior transfer from Texas A&M-Kingsville, to see plenty of action and to start in the three-wide set. Hughes stands 6-2 and weighs 195 pounds. Hughes is a native of Jackson, Miss.

"Vernon shows a lot of promise and potential," said Orth. "He is a physical receiver with a great work ethic. He wants to do well. He is going to be in our top-five rotation of receivers."

Brian Box (So.-SQ, 5-9, 165, Beaumont, Texas/Hardin-Jefferson), Michael Soto (So.-SQ, 5-8, 150, Stockdale, Texas/Stockdale), and Robert Salinas (So.-TR, 5-9, 165, McAllen, Texas/Memorial) are the projected back-ups in the three-wide set.

"We have six quality receivers, and don't sell Box or Soto short," Parker said. "Box is the quickest kid on the football team. We have a great group of receivers overall that should make plays for us."

DEFENSE -

Second-year defensive coordinator Chris Castillo has settled in as the Bulldog defensive signal-caller. Castillo has liked the production in preseason that he has seen from his 2009 Bulldogs. He notes the Bulldogs will lack some size up front, but he said there will be no shortage of hard-hitting and hustle to the football.

"We're going to run to the football and tackle better than we did last year," said Castillo. "We have to eliminate the missed tackles and become more physical."

"We talk toughness – hitting tough, being tough for 60 minutes. We're going to get our

play-makers on the field. We know with our schedule that we're gong to have come out and show that we have made improvements. We expect everybody to have improved in our conference. But we expect to be improved as well. There is a different level of commitment here this season. We can all sense that."

Castillo characterizes the defensive line as "undersized but aggressive and able to get off the ball well," the linebackers as "athletic with good depth and competition at the position," and the secondary as "very athletic, fast, but young."

DEFENSIVE LINE

As in the case on offense with the fifth-year returns of Josh McNeil and Jonathon Randle, the defense received a gift of its own in the offseason when senior defensive end James Villarreal decided to take advantage of his fifth year.

Villarreal decided to use his medical redshirt, obtained in his freshman season, and postpone graduation for just a few more months.

Villarreal (6-1, 250, Sinton/Sinton) started nine games for TLU in 2008 (he missed one game to injury) and led the Bulldogs in tackles for

loss, with nine. He also collected two sacks and forced two fumbles.

"James brings senior leadership and an ability to make plays wherever he is on the field," said Castillo. "He'll be the 3-technique this year. He's the guy on the front that has to be good because he is going to get single-blocked. He has to make the plays, and James is the guy that will do that for us."

At defensive end, the Bulldogs have another senior leader in starting defensive end John Jackson (Sr.-2L, 6-1, 215, Panama City, Panama/Converse Judson), who displayed flashes of brilliance in 2008. Jackson was one of 11 players from 2008 to start in all 10 games en route to posting 8.5 tackles for losses of 33 yards, with 4.5 sacks for 22 yards. He had a career-best nine tackles (four solo, five assists) in the road loss to nationally-ranked Mary Hardin-Baylor.

"John is a tough player and hard worker," said Castillo. "He makes plays. He has a great get-off from the snap and a high motor on the field."

Senior Eric Walker (Sr.-2L, 6-0, 235, Los Fresnos, Texas/Los Fresnos) will start for a third year on the defensive line. He'll get the

start at nose tackle. The fourth starter on the defensive line will be true freshman Chris Kyle (Fr.-FY, 6-0, 208, McAllen, Texas/McAllen), who gets the nod at the other defensive end.

"Eric is tough," said Castillo. "He hustles every play, and he's the hardest worker on our defense."

Giving the Bulldogs some depth on the defensive line will be: Christopher Reyna (So.-SQ, 5-9, 225, Houston, Texas/Waltrip), Victor Espinosa (Fr.-FY, 5-11, 225, Killeen, Texas/Harker Heights), Louie Galvez (Jr.-FY, 5-8, 230, Houston, Texas/Cypress Fairbanks), Luis Flores (Fr.-FY, 6-2, 238, Monterrey, Texas/Sharyland (Texas)), and Roger Cantu (5-11, 210, So.-FY, McAllen/Memorial).

IINFRACKER

The linebacking unit took a hit when TLU's 2008 leading tackler Jarrad McAdams did not return for his junior season, but the Bulldogs are moving forward with a sleek unit built upon solid veterans and newcomers. Leading the group will be junior and two-year starter Jack Moses (Jr.-2L, 6-1, 215, San Antonio, Texas/Churchill). Moses played and started in all 10 games a year ago and finished third on team in total tackles, with a career-high 63. He also posted a career-best seven tackles for loss, for 33 yards in losses and recorded 2.5 sacks (for 26 yards). He hit double-digits in tackles in four different games, including a 12-tackle performance to end the year against Mississippi College.

"Jack is smart, and he's our best coverage linebacker," said Castillo. "He can get us lined up and get us out of trouble."

Moses is being pushed in the preseason by newcomer Dan Lopez (Jr.-TR, 5-9, 200, Corpus Christi, Texas/Calallen/Bacone (Okla.)), a hard-hitting and physical linebacker that should see plenty of time on the field in 2009.

With Moses and Lopez competing at one outside linebacking spot, the middle linebacker position is a battle between returners Jeff Davis (Sr.-2L, 5-11, 225, Houston, Texas/Alief Hastings) and Trey Parma (So.-1L, 6-0, 220, Yorktown, Texas/Yorktown) and first-year player Jonathan Rodriguez (Fr.-FY, 6-0, 185, San Antonio/Southwest). Davis missed all of 2008, and Parma earned his first varsity letter last season. Parma played in eight games and made six starts (all at linebacker) in 2008. He finished the year with career-best seven tackles against Mississippi College.

At the other outside linebacker spot, Joseph Mendoza (Jr.-1L, 5-9, 195, Houston, Texas/Bellaire) and Don Gadberry (So.-1L, 5-11, 228, Dallas, Texas/Duncanville) are in a battle to start.

"All the (linebacker) spots are basically up in the air," said Castillo. "It's a good problem to have, and we have some depth with some guys that can do some different things – whether in pass coverage or stopping the run."

SECONDARY

The loss of departed seniors Robert Bonner and Dwight Bonner creates openings for new players in the secondary. Among the projected starters for 2009, only safety Dantrell Anderson saw time as a starter in 2008.

Anderson (So.-1L, 5-11, 185, Mobile, Alab./Cedar Hill (Texas)) is the play-maker of the unit. The starter at strong safety, Anderson displayed his speed and athletic ability a year ago when he saw significant time as a freshman. He posted a career-best 12 tackles, with three tackles for loss, in the home victory over Sul Ross State on Oct. 11. His three tackles for loss (another career high) went for 13 yards and included one of his two sacks on the year. He also had seven tackles (plus a tackle for loss) in road win at Howard Payne.

"We're expecting big things in the secondary from Dantrell Anderson," said Castillo. "He's a big hitter and athletic. He's around the ball quite a bit. We want our strong safety to come in the box and stop the run, or in a pass situation to play a deep half or deep third."

The starting job at free safety is a battle between two sophomores, Julio Reyes (So.-1L,

5-10, 160, Houston, Texas/South Houston) and Devin Davis (So.-1L, 6-1, 195, San Antonio, Texas/Converse Judson).

The Bulldogs will have new starting cornerbacks in Acie Washington (Fr.-TR, 6-0, 200, Houston, Texas/Milby/West Texas A&M) and Leonard Durand (Fr.-RS, 5-8, 175, Galveston, Texas/Ball). Durand is a dynamic athlete that burst onto the Bulldogs' radar in his first collegiate game a year ago. In the second game of the year, a contest played at Trinity University, Durand (playing wide receiver) hustled back to make a fumblecausing hit after a Trinity interception. Unfortunately, Durand was lost for the season with a knee injury shortly after that play and received a medical redshirt. For 2009, Durand brings his speed and hard-hitting ability to the corner.

Other defensive backs vying for significant playing time are: Zack Weathersby (Jr.-TR, 5-7, 165, Jackson, Miss./Forest/Mississippi College), Joshua Arce (So.-TR, 5-11, 205, San Antonio, Texas/Warren/Texas State), and Caston Boyd (So.-1L, 5-10, 170, La Marque, Texas/La Marque).

SPECIAL TEAMS

The special teams unit will be headed by

Parker in 2009. At his disposal he'll have, in his opinion, the best punter in the conference (Frank Vera). With the Bulldogs set at punter, Parker and kicking coach Buzzy Keller need to find a starting kicker. Parker lists kicker as one of the top needs entering the season.

"We'll have the best punter in the conference, and the best kick return and best punt return in the conference," said Parker. "And if we don't have good performances at quarterback, we'll need a kicker and a strong kicking game to compensate for not being as good at quarterback. The kicking game will be critical."

PUNTER

Frank Vera (Sr.-3L, 5-9, 150, Laredo, Texas/Nixon) is the unquestioned starter at punter. A threat to do something special on trick plays (as a holder, punter, or wing back) with his arm or legs, Vera most importantly has improved each year as a punter. And now he clearly ranks as one of the league's best, if not the best punter, entering '09. After an ASC Honorable Mention selection in 2008, Vera is poised to make 2009 an All-ASC season (or possibly better). Vera started all 10 games again as the team's Special Teams Player of the Year

for a second straight year after averaging 39.4 yards per punt. He had a long punt of 66 in the overtime win at Sul Ross State, and he put 15 punts inside the opponent's 20-yard line.

PLACE-KICKER

The battle for starting kicker will come down to two freshmen - Allen Cain (Fr.-FY, 6-2, 165, San Antonio, Texas/Stevens) and Justin Guerrero (Fr.-FY, 5-11, 190, Alice, Texas/Alice). The Bulldogs need improvement from the position from the numbers put forth in 2008. The Bulldogs of last year made just four of 10 field goal attempts and were just 1-for-5 in attempts over 40 yards.

PUNT RETURN

Punt return duties will be manned by Brian Box (So.-SQ, 5-9, 165, Beaumont, Texas/Hardin-Jefferson) and Leonard Durand (Fr.-RS, 5-8, 175, Galveston, Texas/Ball).

Box and Durand, two of the fastest players on the team, could provide big boosts to a special teams unit that averaged only 5.4 yards per return a year ago.

KICK RETURN

Anthony Smith will anchor the kick return unit in 2009. If Smith returns to his 2007 form as a kickoff returner (the year he returned 27 kicks for 579 yards – an average of 21.4 per return), that type of performance would have a great impact in the Bulldogs' overall offensive efforts. Smith has the ability to go the distance with each kickoff return. He took the opening kickoff of 2007 back 92 yards for a TD against Sul Ross State.

Box, Eddie Pitts (Fr.-FY, 5-10, 220, San Antonio, Texas/Madison), and Quinnten Cleveland (Jr.-SQ, 5-9, 190, Galveston, Texas/Ball) also could see time at kick return in 2009

HOLDER / DEEP SNAPPER

Vera will start again as the holder, and he always poses the threat of a trick play or two from that position. Because he is a good scrambler and an able passer of the football, opposing teams in the ASC always have to keep a special eye on Vera.

The deep snapping starting job will be a battle between freshman Andrew Wroth (Fr.-FY, 6-1, 160, Friendswood/Friendswood) and Billy Hardee (5-10, 205, Houston/Marine Military Academy). Hardee saw time at deep snapper last season.

The Texas Lutheran Bulldogs have been picked sixth in the 2009 American Southwest Conference Preseason Football Poll after a vote by the league's head coaches, sports information directors and selected media

The University of Mary Hardin-Baylor is the 2009 preseason favorite in the ASC. The Crusaders have won four consecutive conference crowns.

Preseason player of the year honors went to Hardin-Simmons University quarterback Justin Feaster, East Texas Baptist University defensive end Austin Sturrock and Louisiana College return man Jordan Rideaux.

Mary Hardin-Baylor, which went 12-2 overall (8-0 in ASC) and reached the national semifinals of the NCAA Division III playoffs for the second straight time last season, was followed in the preseason poll by Hardin-Simmons, Mississippi College, East Texas Baptist, and Louisiana College.

TLU, Sul Ross State, Howard Payne and McMurry filled in the final four spots in the

The 2009 Bulldogs and third-year Head Coach Dennis Parker return 17 starters (seven on offense, seven on defense, and three on special teams) from a 2008 squad that went 4-6 overall and 3-5 in the ASC.

The Bulldogs finished sixth in the nineteam ASC a year ago. TLU was the sixth pick in the 2008 ASC Preseason Football Poll.

TLU has 38 lettermen returning for 2009. Of those 38 lettermen, 19 lettermen return on defense, and 16 lettermen return on offense.

Three starting special-teamers will also be back on the team.

The 2009 ASC season – the 14th in league history - opens Sept. 5, with six league members in action (East Texas Baptist, Hardin-Simmons, Louisiana College, McMurry and Mississippi College).

The NCAA Division III Football Championship playoffs are scheduled for a Nov. 21 start, with the Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl national championship game on tap for Dec. 19.

Mumme to McMurry

McMurry University's football program has been in desperate need of an overhaul, and the university believed that Hal Mumme would be the man to create the change needed to a program that has just three winning seasons since 1994. Mumme welcomed 97 players to campus in preparation for the 2009 season.

Mumme, the highly touted offensive coach and originator of the Air Raid offense that many of the big-time schools in the NCAA Division I are running including Texas Tech, came to McMurry as head coach in April.

Mumme said that his initial meeting with the players would have a simple message, and the same one that he's given for 20 years.

"Give an honest effort, be loyal to your teammates, and communicate," Mumme said. "We have one rule: Don't hurt the team. There are three things that will get you automatically dismissed from our program: drugs, beating up someone weaker than you, and stealing. And as far as football goes, the most important play is the next play. Play the next play."

Santiago Builds Program

Mike Santiago came to San Antonio in late May of 2007 saying he had always wanted to coach football at a Catholic university and along with that he had dreamed of starting a football program at the collegiate level. When he was offered and accepted the Incarnate Word position, he knew what he was getting just maybe he didn't know what he was getting into.

Over the first 12 months at UIW, he often was heard saying "be careful what you wish for..." And so, after weeks of rushing from a recruiting meeting to a session about the Gayle and Tom Benson Stadium construction project to another gathering concerning budgeting or admissions or maybe purchasing of equipment, Mike Santiago was dreaming of "coaching football players."

In February of 2008 Incarnate Word announced its first-ever recruiting class and on that first signing day the Cardinals inked 27 players. At Seguin's Matador Stadium, TLU held a three-point edge (17-14) over Sul Ross State as Sul Ross drove into TLU territory. The Lobos had a 1st-and-10 from the TLU 22 before the Bulldog defense stiffened and forced Sul Ross QB Monte Morales into his third interception of the

Alvarado's interception came on 4th-and-20 for Sul Ross State from the TLU 32. Alvarado picked off the pass at the TLU 25 and scurried up the Sul Ross State sideline, picking up two key blocks from his teammates on his way to the endzone.

TLU's two other conference wins came on the road. The Bulldogs started a three-game midseason win streak on Oct. 4 with a 28-21 win in Brownwood over Howard Payne. The Bulldogs withstood a fourth-quarter rally by the Yellow Jackets. TLU senior quarterback Joel Waldon threw the game-winning touchdown to Steven Trash at the 6:21 mark of the fourth quarter. The pass to Thrash went for nine yards and capped a six-play, 55-yard drive.

The winning drive was kept alive by a 3rd-and-7 completion of 42 yards from Waldon to Anthony Smith. Smith motioned out of the backfield and caught the pass near the HPU 17 and stumbled down to the HPU 10. After the home win over Sul Ross State made it two

TLU wins in a row, the Bulldogs headed to Abilene for a match-up against the winless McMurry football team. The Bulldogs held McMurry to 26 yards of total offense and forced five turnovers in an 18-0 shutout at Wilford Moore Stadium in Abilene. TLU won its third consecutive game and moved to 4-3 overall and to 3-2 in the American Southwest Conference. McMurry lost its 11th game in a row (dating back to the end of the 2007 season) and dropped to 0-8 overall and to 0-6 in the

The shutout for TLU was its first since a 45-0 defeat of Austin College on Sept. 2, 2006 in Seguin. TLU set a new school record for fewest passing yards by an opponent, holding McMurry to 21 yards through the air. McMurry completed 4-of-16 passes and threw three interceptions. The old TLU record for fewest passing yards by an opponent was set in 1974 against Trinity. The Bulldogs held the Tigers to 25 passing yards in a 37-0 victory.

TLU held McMurry without a third-down conversion (0-for-13) and limited McMurry to 46 total offensive plays. McMurry rushed 30 times for five yards.

2008 SEASON IN REVIEW

The Bulldogs recorded eight tackles for loss, resulting in 43 yards in losses. The Bulldogs also picked up five sacks (for 40 yards), recovered two fumbles, tallied 84 interception return yards and broke up four passes.

At the conclusion of the regular season, TLU senior tight end Ty Palmer shared the inaugural ASC Sportsmanship Athlete of the Year Award for football with ZaVious Robbins of Hardin-Simmons and Brannon Willisson of Mississippi College after a vote of the league's nine head coaches.

Palmer, Robbins, and Willisson were announced as the sportsmanship winners along with the naming of the 2008 ASC All-Conference Football Teams. Palmer was honored along with six of his Bulldog teammates in the conference announcement.

Five Bulldogs – senior offensive lineman John Paul Bloomer, senior defensive end James Villarreal, senior defensive back Dwight Bonner, junior wide receiver Steven Thrash and sophomore linebacker Jarrad McAdams - were named to the All-ASC Second Team.

Junior punter Frank Vera took a spot on the All-ASC Honorable Mention team.

Villarreal led the team in tackles for loss (9.0 for 29 yards) and finished 2008 with 36 total tackles, two sacks, and two forced fumbles. Villarreal started two seasons at defensive end and led the team in tackles for loss in 2007 as well. He has 21 career tackles for loss (tied for seventh in the TLU career list for the NCAA Division III era).

Bonner led the team in interceptions, with four, and finished second on the team in tackles, with 68. Bonner, who played cornerback and safety in his four years as a Bulldog, tied for the TLU DIII-era lead in career interceptions with 16. He set the school DIII-era record for interception return yardage at 238. Bonner collected 191 total tackles in his four years. He is fourth on the school DIII-era tackle list

In his first year as an every-game starter, Thrash led the team in scoring (30 points), reception yards (614). receiving touchdowns (5), total receptions (45), and reception yards per game (61.4). Thrash had a career-best touchdown reception of 77 yards in the season-ending contest against Mississippi College.

McAdams led the team in tackles, with 70, and added six tackles for 20 yards in losses, a sack, two interceptions, two forced fumbles, a fumble recovery, and a blocked kick. McAdams started all 10 games for the Bulldogs.

Vera started for the second season as the team's punter. He punted 55 times for 2,167 yards (an average of 39.4 yards per punt). He improved his punting average by nearly three yards per punt from the 2007 season. In 2008, Vera had a career-long punt of 66 yards and placed 15 punts inside the opponent's 20-yard line.

Palmer was also the male recipient of the 2008-09 American Southwest Conference Fred Jacoby Sportsmanship Award, the conference office announced after a vote of the league's directors of athletics. The ASC Fred Jacoby Sportsmanship Award honors male and female student-athletes who best display the attributes of sportsmanship, leadership, citizenship and academic integrity in their athletic, academic and life pursuits. A four-year letterman and three-year starter in football,

Palmer was a 2007 ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District VI First Team selection, a three-time ASC Academic All-Conference selection, the 2008-09 TLU Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year, and the 2008-09 TLU Male Community Service award winner. He finished his bachelor's degree with a GPA of 3.8.



The National Championships 1974 and 1975

he record books, the TLU Hall of Fame inductees and the two national championship trophies all validate the claim that the 1974 and 1975 Bulldog football teams are the best squads the school has ever produced. Blessed with an impenetrable defense, a quick-strike offense and a dashing and innovative head coach, the Bulldogs stormed to back-to-back national titles and in the process re-wrote record books and etched themselves forever in school history.

Led by Head Coach Jim Wacker, Texas Lutheran embarked on a magical run in 1974 with its first of six shutouts coming in a 30-0 rout of Tarleton State. For the Bulldogs, the average margin of victory in 1974 was 36 points. In that season, the Bulldogs scored 421 points (still the TLU mark for points in a season) and allowed only 44 (another active school record). Twenty-nine NAIA Division II records fell in the 1974 championship game, a 42-0 blowout victory over Missouri Valley.

Of the 15 team records in the school record book, the 1974 team holds seven of the marks. In addition to the season scoring and season defense records, the 1974 'Dogs set the standards for season rushing yardage (3,610), total offense (5,020), rushing yards allowed per game (65.6), and total yards allowed per game (172.5).

Although not as prevalent in the records books as the 1974 squad, the 1975 Bulldogs accomplished what no other NAIA team to that date had done repeat as a national champion. The '75 team averaged 285.2 rushing yards per game and limited opponents to just 111.3 yards a game. Pass defense was a specialty of the '75 squad, which still holds the school record for fewest passing yards allowed per game


In the 1975 NAIA Championship Game, the Bulldogs rolled to a 34-8 victory. Quarterback Mike Washington accounted for three of the Bulldogs' scores. He scored on a 60-yard run and threw two touchdown passes to Brock Kalmbach.

Of all the players and coaches on the 1974 and 1975 teams, those now enshrined in the TLU Hall of Honor are: Washington, Wacker, Offensive Line Coach Verl "Jiggs" Westergard, Secondary Coach Ray Katt, defensive tackle Phil Dunne, defensive back Kevin Ott, fullback David Wehmeyer, and linebacker D.W. Rutledge.



JIM WACKER

TLU HALL OF FAME — HEAD COACH 1971-1975

The head coach in Texas Lutheran's 1974 and 1975 NAIA title runs was the great Iim Wacker. With boundless energy and enthusiasm, Wacker and his staff (including current TLU head coach Tom Mueller) built the Bulldogs into a small college power. In his time with the Bulldogs, Wacker coached Texas Lutheran to a 38-16 mark and a record of 28-5 in his final three seasons in Seguin. Wacker holds the school record for best career winning percentage among football coaches (at .704). He shares, with volleyball coach Susan Duke, the Texas Lutheran mark for most national titles won, with two.

The Bulldogs of the Wacker era set numerous school records for career, season and single-game feats. Today, 23 records from those Wacker squads still stand, including a school-record 17-game winning streak that stretched from 1973 to 1975. Wacker's Bulldogs were also prominent members of several All-America squads. Walter Bartosh, Phil Dunne, Jerry Ellis, Joe Froelich, Willie Gipson, Royce Johnson, Dennis Ortmann, Kevin Ott,



Jim Perdue, D.W. Rutledge, Bobby Sagebiel, Walter Ulbrecht, Mike Washington, and David Wehmeyer all earned All-America honors while playing for Jim Wacker.

Wacker departed Texas Lutheran after the 1975 championship victory over California Lutheran and went on to successful coaching stays at North Dakota State, Southwest Texas State, Texas Christian and Minnesota. He went 42-8 in four years at Southwest

Texas and won two NCAA Division II national titles with the Bobcats. From 1974 to 1982, his won-loss record was 88-18-01. During this nine-year period, he was the winningest college football coach in the nation.

At Texas Christian, Wacker took a Horned Frogs program that was 17-90-3 in the previous 10 seasons and turned it into a bowl team. TCU went 8-3 in the 1984 regular season and earned in invitation to the


Bluebonnet Bowl. Wacker was named the 1984 National Coach of the Year by The Sporting News, UPI and ESPN. Wacker was also the recipient of the American Sportsmanship Council's Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Award. Wacker and his staff doubled the graduation rate during nine seasons at TCU and earned the CFA Award for Academic Excellence for a 100 percent graduation rate in 1991.

At Minnesota, Wacker's Golden Gophers set Academic All-Big 10 records for academic all-conference selections as Minnesota led the Big 10 for three consecutive years in academic all-conference honors. Wacker completed his coaching career in 1996 with a career mark of 160-130-3.

Coach Wacker died in August of 2003 after a bout with cancer. TLU honored the Wacker family at the 2003 Homecoming game. The Bulldogs dedicated that victory and their entire 2003 season to Coach Wacker and the Wacker family. TLU players wore "JW" stickers on their helmets throughout the year.

back national championships in 1974 and 1975 and to a national semifinal appearance in 1976.

Washington was an NAIA All-America quarterback in each of those three seasons. In 1976, he was named NAIA Offensive Player of the Vear

The Austin native and Austin Johnston High School graduate was a four-year letterman at Texas Lutheran. During his career at the university, the Bulldogs had a 39-5 won-loss record. Washington amassed 5,276 yards of total offense in four years at Texas Lutheran, and he scored 40 touchdowns and passed for 27 more. His 40 rushing touchdowns remain a school mark.

At the end of Washington's collegiate career, Texas Lutheran retired the No. 10 jersey as a sign of appreciation for his contributions to Bulldog athletics. The Bulldogs' offensive player of the year award is now called the "Mike Washington Most Valuable Player Award."

"Mike is the finest athlete I've ever coached," said Jim Wacker, Washington's coach at Texas Lutheran. "He was the most exciting veer quarterback I've ever seen play the game. He was undoubtedly the catalyst for our two national championships. It was a great privilege to have coached such a fine young man. He was truly an outstanding competitor."

Washington was elected to the NAIA Hall of Fame on Oct. 17, 1984. He was officially inducted in the Hall on Jan. 9, 1985 in Nashville, Tenn., at the NAIA Hall of Fame induction ceremony.

Following graduation from Texas Lutheran, Washington played one season in the Canadian Football League as a quarterback/wide receiver for the Winnipeg Blue Bombers. He returned to Texas Lutheran and served one year as an admissions counselor before accepting a coaching position at Corpus Christi Moody High School.

In December of 1978, Washington accepted a position in the admissions office at the University of Texas. He has worked for the University of Texas as an assistant registrar for registration, and he currently serves UT in the university's admissions office.
